He mainly targeted auto-rickshaw drivers, garbage collectors, workers and labourers in the area. I remember soon after the partition, there was a 100% curfew because people were being forced to rush and also to leave their homes," he said.

Rajkumar, 54, a businessman, said he was born in the basement of DDA flats in Dujana House was later converted into a dispensary, and then into a school. It is now vacant and locked.

People such as Rajkumar were at the centre of what became one of the government's 25-point programme during the Emergency, plugging into the national obligation with population control in the 1970s and 80s. Sanjay Gandhi launched sterilisation camps and urged ministers to meet mass sterilisation targets, encouraging officials to exceed them. This misplaced zeal percolated through the government system - lower rank officers were asked to undergo operations or their careers were not cleared, truck drivers could not get their licences renewed.

2 men from Haryana killed in US accident

KARNAL: Two men from Haryana died in a road accident in the United States, people aware of the matter said on Tuesday.

The accident took place in the US state of California on Monday when the two victims, identified as Vishal Kumar (21) from Karnal and Arun Jagan Alan from (24) Karnal, were reportedly travelling in a car that hit a truck.

Families of the victims said that they were informed about the accident on Tuesday morning.

IM-M launches new incubation centre

MUMBAI: The Indian Institute of Management (IIM) Mumbai on Tuesday launched a new incubation centre to encourage innovation and support aspiring entrepreneurs.

The centre, called the IIM-NITE Incubation Foundation for Innovation and Entrepreneurship (IIM-NIFE), was inaugurated by Union Minister Jitendra Singh.

The centre falls under the Atal Innovation Mission and aims to assist innovators and startups.

Trump suggested the ceasefire would allow Iran oil to continue to flow, saying on social media that China could keep buying oil from Iran.

The deal got off to a rocky start. An Israeli military official who spoke on the condition of anonymity in line with military reporting rules said Iran launched two missiles at Israel boats in the eastern ceasefire. Both were intercepted, the official said.

Iranian state television reported that the military denied firing missiles after the start of the ceasefire - while condemning Israel for possible strikes of its own. One of those attacks killed a high-profile nuclear scientist, Mohammad Reza Shajariani, at his father-in-law's residence in northern Iran, Iranian state TV reported.

As Trump spoke to reporters at the White House before departing for the NATO summit, he expressed disappointment with both sides. Iran "violated it, but Israel violated it too," Trump said. "It's not happy with both."

Trump's frustration was palpable, using an expletive to hammer home his point. "We basically have two countries that have been fighting so long and so hard that they don't know what the f--- they're doing," he said.

Later, however, he announced that Israel had backed off its threat to attack Tehran and instead agreed to a bilateral ceasefire with Iran, in coordination with Trump, after the country achieved all of its war goals, including removing the threat of Iran's nuclear and ballistic missile programs.

It's unclear what role Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, Iran's leader, played in the talks. He said earlier on social media that he would not surrender.

Trump said Tuesday that he wasn't seeking regime change in Iran, two days after floating the idea himself in a social media post. "I don't want it," Trump told reporters on Air Force One. "Regime change takes chaos and, ideally, we don't want to see much chaos."

Before the ceasefire was announced, Israel's military said it had launched 30 missiles toward Iraq. Police said they damaged at least three densely populated residential buildings in the city of Berrheba. First responders said they retrieved four bodies from one building and were searching for more. At least 100 people were injured.

Outside, the shells of burned-out cars littered the streets. Broken glass and rubble covered the area. Police said some people were injured and inside their apartments' reinforced safe rooms, which are meant to withstand rockets but not direct hits from ballistic missiles.

The attack followed a limited Iranian missile attack Monday on a U.S. military base in Qatar, retaliating for earlier American bombing of its nuclear sites. The U.S. was warned by Iran in January that it would use force if the U.S. military bases in Iraq were attacked. Some Iranian nuclear military bases in Iraq, including one housing US troops, the Iraqi army and a US military base, were said Tuesday.
